French Riviera Orientation Tour Add-On for Airport or Hotel Transfers Tour NCE021



Approximately 3½ hours • \$79
Add-on sightseeing to go with your transfer to the airport or to your Windstar hotel (guests must already have a prepaid transfer voucher or will need to buy one prior to purchasing this tour)

Departing the ship, you will take a 45-minute drive along the Promenade des Anglais and the Lower Corniche, one of the most scenic routes of the French Riviera. Watch for the famous resorts of Beaulieu and the oasis of peace and quiet, Eze Sur Mer. As the road hugs the rocky coast, Cap d'Ail comes into view. Your coach will pass through Monaco along the Grand Prix raceway to meet the Grande Corniche, where the Vista Hotel stands. From the viewpoint (traffic permitting), there is a marvelous panorama of the coast from the Italian border over Cap Martin to the Principality of Monaco. Your next stop will be at the village of La Turbie, built on the Grande Corniche at an altitude of 1,200 feet. Back on the Middle Corniche you will stop at Eze—a strangely isolated village that clings like an eagle's nest to a rock spike towering over the sea. The panorama extends from the tip of Cap d'Ail to Esterel, Beaulieu, Cap Ferrat, Villefranche sur Mer, Nice and Cap d'Antibes. Your last stop is at Mont Boron

before a short sightseeing tour of Nice en route to the airport or your hotel.

Please note: This tour will end either at the airport or at your Windstar hotel. This tour is available only to guests whose flight leaves at 3:00pm or later, or to guests staying overnight in Nice.

DE MALLORCA, SPAIN



Mallorca Uncorked Tour PMI004

Specially for those who delight with the pleasures of wine tasting, this tour shows that Mallorca is a great producer of fine wines. A short drive from the port is the village of Sant Joan where Els Calderers, a traditional manor of Mallorca's flat land, is located. This estate's history can be traced back to 1285, when the manor is mentioned in historic records for the first time. Here you will see what Mallorca looked and felt like some two hundred years ago, with its outbuildings for cattle breeding, farming activities and its indigenous animals. Savor a taste of *sobrassada*, a typical Mallorcan sausage made from pork, as well as cheese, and a sampling of six different wines
